Environmental Evaluation (EE)

- Specific to NRCS
- Required for all conservation planning activities
- Considers impacts of alternatives on
 - Soil, Water, Air, Plant, Animal, and Energy resources
 - Human social and economic concerns
 - "Special Environmental Concerns"
- Used to determine the level of NEPA analysis needed when NRCS funds or authorizes a planned activity
 - Categorical Exclusion
 - Environmental Assessment
 - Environmental Impact Statement

NEPA Sec. 102

...all agencies of the federal government shall

- A. utilize a systematic, interdisciplinary approach which will insure the integrated use of the natural and social sciences and the environmental design arts in planning and in decisionmaking which may have an impact on man's environment;
- B. identify and develop methods and procedures...which will insure that...environmental amenities and values may be given appropriate consideration in decisionmaking along with economic and technical considerations....

NRCS NEPA Implementing Regulations [7 CFR, Part 650]

- Environmental evaluation (EE) is the part of planning that inventories and estimates the potential effects on the human environment of alternative solutions to resource problems.
- The EE integrates environmental concerns throughout the planning, installation, and operation of NRCS-assisted projects. The EE applies to all assistance provided by NRCS...

7 CFR Part 650.3 (b)(4)

Insure that plans satisfy identified needs and at the same time minimize adverse effects of planned actions on the human environment through interdisciplinary planning before providing technical and financial assistance.

An environmental evaluation is a concurrent part of the planning process in which the potential long-term and short-term impacts of an action on people, their physical or social surroundings, and nature are evaluated and alternative actions explored. The EE is required for all NRCS planning activities and is documented on Form NRCS-CPA-52, "Environmental Evaluation Worksheet."



GM 180, Part 409(H): The EE, which may lead to an environmental assessment (EA) or environmental impact statement (EIS), <u>will be</u> <u>conducted for all NRCS planning activities</u> and will be used to help determine the level of NEPA documentation required 440 CPM 514.44 A. "...development of the preliminary WRPO begins during the onsite ranking visits with the landowner and NRCS...The purpose of the preliminary WRPO is to provide sufficient information to allow the landowner to understand the project's anticipated scope and effect, including habitat objectives and anticipated restoration, management, and O&M requirements.... This basic information is necessary...to determine whether to proceed in the enrollment process."

440-CPM 514.44 B. - "The preliminary WRPO— ...Includes an NRCS Environmental Evaluation using Form NRCS-CPA-52, which should be completed as part of the planning process...."

- Client Objectives
 - Program purposes must be met
 - Restore, protect, enhance wetlands
 - Maximize wildlife habitat benefits
- Benchmark Conditions
 - Soil, water, air, plant, animal?
 - Public health and safety, land use, labor, management level?
 - Cultural resources, endangered/threatened species, invasive species?

Compatible Use Authorization

- Client Objectives
 - Further long-term protection and enhancement of the wetland and other natural values or the area
- Effects of Alternatives
 - Document how the CUA
 - Furthers long-term protection and enhancement
 - Effect on habitat
 - Migratory Birds
 - T&E, at-risk species


• Permits Required


- Clean Water Act Section 404
 - Nationwide Permit (NWP) 27 -Aquatic Habitat Restoration, Establishment, and Enhancement Activities
 - To be authorized by this NWP, the activity must result in aquatic habitat that resembles an ecological reference.
